## **Assignment Summary**

Take a walk on the wild side and help conserve Vanuatu's threatened species and ecosystems whilst improving the livelihoods of the local community!

Vanuatu lies in the East Melanesian Islands hotspot for Biodiversity and has a high number of endemic species and iconic species such as dugongs and sea turtles. There are untapped opportunities to develop ecotourism products based on this natural wealth. However there is a fine balance between tourism helping threatened species and causing them or communities harm. Your expertise will shift the balance in favour of conservation whilst improving local livelihoods.

VESS is a young organisation and our aim is to use science as a tool for conservation in Vanuatu and to encourage Ni-Vanuatu scientists. VESS is currently implementing the Dugong and Seagrass Conservation project, a global GEF-funded project involving eight developing countries. We are also working on a CEPF-funded project to increase awareness of threatened species in Vanuatu. Ecotourism potential involving these animals and plants will be explored under these projects and incorporated into workshops derived to communities.

You will identify potential ecotourism products involving wildlife that could improve livelihoods of people. You will help develop guidelines and codes of conduct for tourism operators to improve the livelihoods of these animals and plants, and the people who share their habitats. You will also investigate opportunities for "voluntourism" as a sustainable mechanism for funding conservation programs to protect Vanuatu's threatened species.

In your role you will help the VESS Ni-Vanuatu scientists, officers in the Department of Tourism and community members better understand the benefits and pitfalls of ecotourism involving wildlife.

Description of the HO:	The Vanuatu Environmental Science Society (VESS) was established in 2014. The society's aims are to conserve threatened species and ecosystems in Vanuatu. Our approach is to work in collaboration with government, other NGOs and the public to increase the awareness of threatened species; to fill data gaps with scientific studies; and to ensure information is available to enable communities to protect and conserve their surrounding areas whilst promoting sustainable development. VESS currently has two projects for conserving Vanuatu's fauna and flora. VESS is the implementing partner for the Vanuatu activities for a global GEF-funded Dugong and Seagrass Conservation Project. Australia is a supporting partner for this project and has pledge \$5 million in support of the project. The other is a CEPF-funded project to increase awareness of threatened species in Vanuatu.	
	VESS has an office at Anchor House in Port Vila and employs 3 staff members. We also employ students on a casual basis to help implement the projects.

### **Description of Assignment Location**

Port Vila is the capital and largest city of Vanuatu with a population of approximately 45 000. It is situated on the south coast of Efate Island in Shefa Province and serves as the tourism and commercial centre of Vanuatu. Port Vila is built around a bay; many areas stretch up the hillsides, offering a combination of stunning harbour views with a faded French atmosphere. Services include daily international flights, phone and internet coverage, quality restaurants and supermarkets and banking facilities. Buses in the form of mini vans, and walking, are the most common modes of transportation. Temperatures range from warm to hot throughout the year, with a wet season early in the year, at which time the city is prone to cyclones. Swimming, snorkelling, fishing, enjoying waterfalls and playing team sports are commonplace activities.

#### **Cultural Tips**

- The national language is Bislama, but English and French are both widely spoken
- Casual, modest, loose clothing is usually acceptable in the workplace and in public. Women may like to consider wearing an "island dress". Neat, conservative clothing should be worn for formal occasions
- Most Ni-Vanuatu is religious and attends church on a weekly basis. Meetings, workshops, and sports sessions commonly begin and end with a prayer
