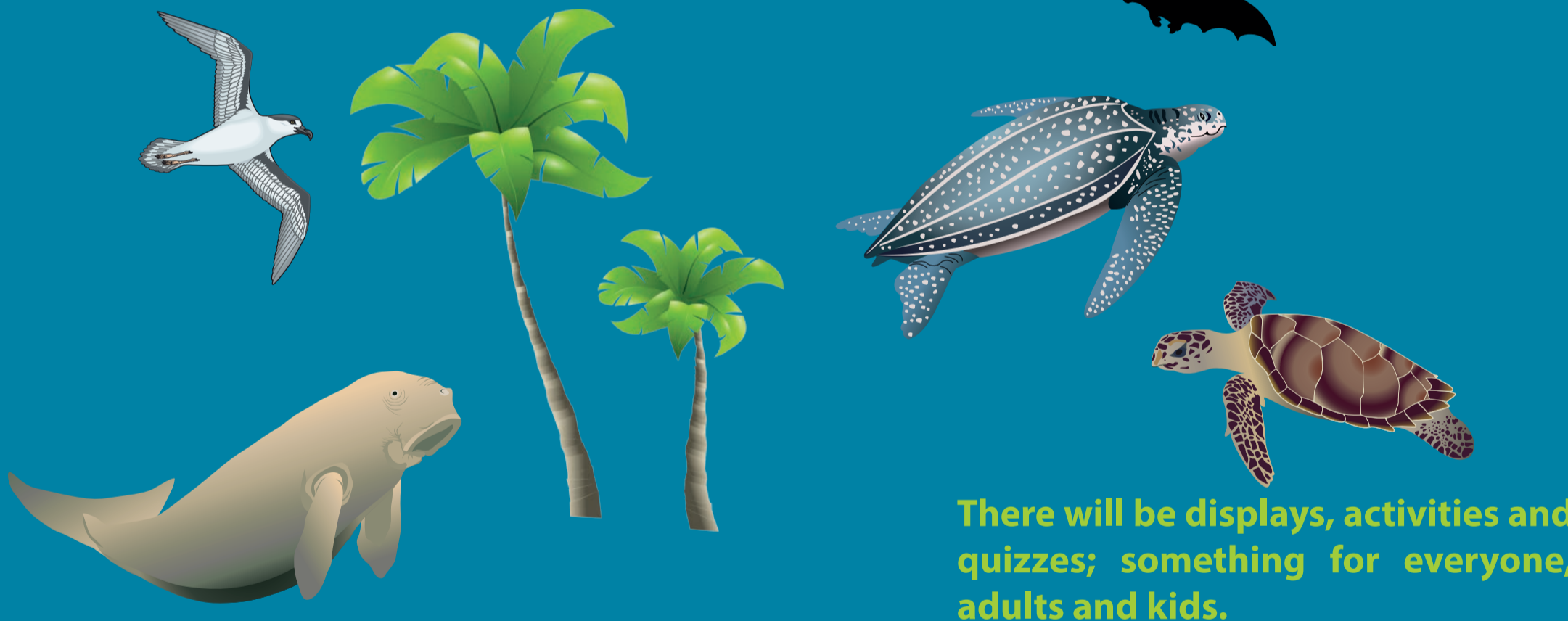
Come and learn about threatened species:

According to the IUCN Red List of threatened species there are 138 species in Vanuatu that are threatened with extinction. In this exhibition we will be showcasing 27 species of animals and plants that have been prioritised for conservation measures by the Critical Ecosystem Partnership Fund.



Entries to the Dugong and Seagrass Handicraft and Art competition will be displayed throughout the exhibition.

This exhibition is being put on by VESS under a project funded by the Critical Ecosystem Partnership Fund (CEPF). The CEPF is a joint initiative of l'Agence Française de Développement, Conservation International, the European Union, the Global Environment Facility, the Government of Japan, the MacArthur Foundation and the World Bank.
